Teaching and Learning

Goals

- For all teachers to use evidence-based practices in their teaching and learning
- For Collective Efficacy to become the cultural norm at Holy Family
- For teachers to have a solid understanding of the progressions of learning in the Australian Curriculum Version 9
- For teachers to differentiate their programs to reflect individual student needs
- For every student to be a creative, connected and engaged learner in our rapidly changing world

- A data plan and schedule will be implemented to monitor student progress in school based and standardised assessments
- The Learning Powers will be relaunched with a focus on learning dispositions
- 90% of students will show a year's growth or 0.4 on whole school assessments in both Literacy and Numeracy
- Students will be more engaged in their learning
- High Impact Teaching Strategies will replace pre-designed programs
- Peer observations and feedback will be conducted twice yearly

- For the language and behaviour of our staff, students and families to reflect the school-wide values of mercy, respect and courage
- That staff, families and students will feel safe and supported at school
- · Student attendance will be 90% or greater
