Classroom News

Library

We are embarking on new learning opportunities to deliver even stronger educational experiences for our students. During student library times our students will participate in STEAM activities linked to a story book being read. The aim of these activities is to foster imagination, creativity, and innovation amongst our students. This is a very exciting space that we will be embedding in our practices across all learning areas.



Technologies

It is important to develop critical thinking and problem solving skills in our students so they can adapt to our ever-changing world. We continue to strive to embed the knowledge and skills to allow our students to become independent life-long learners, to think outside the square and embrace different ways of thinking. We are providing new opportunities in the technologies learning area to ensure our students become critical users of technologies, and designers and producers of designed solutions.

Positive Partnerships 2024 Staff Professional Development Day

Prior to the commencement of Term 1 the staff across our school collaborated to explore and further develop our whole school wide practices to support our students to maximise their wellbeing.

We developed our understanding of sensory processing and the functional impacts on teaching and learning. We examined sensory solutions that can assist students to cope with sensory input and meet their sensory needs. We worked together to develop an understanding of the Australian Student Wellbeing Framework and good mental health supports we can utilise at Holy Family to enable our children to reach their potential.

Keeping Safe Program

The Education Act mandates the teaching of a Protective Behaviours program in all schools. At Holy Family we follow the Keeping Safe Program. The Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) aims to help children learn to recognise abuse and develop ways of protecting themselves from abuse and, in wider terms, covers rights, relationships, responsibilities and ethical behaviour. Stay tuned for updates throughout the vear.



Preschool

Over the first two weeks of preschool, we have focused on settling into the new routine, establishing classroom rules and getting to know each other. Next week we will make mini me people to display and show who is at preschool each day. We will be displaying photos of families to help children feel secure and to look at throughout the day.

We have also started to explore the topic of emotions and friendships and will continue this for the rest of the year. In preschool we have a strong focus on social and emotional learning to help develop important social skills such as:

- problem solving
- · regulating emotions

Social skills are essential to developing relationships and a sense of belonging.

Later in Term 1, we will meet our buddy class. We will focus on building our relationships and social skills through various fun play-based experiences. This will help the children form a connection and familiarise themselves with students and teachers from the school.

We look forward to a fun year in preschool!




HIPPY
