
## School Advisory Board

# TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

**4 QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:** 

#### IS YOUR CHILD RUNNING A FEVER?

If so, he or she should stay home from school. A good rule of thumb is that a child should not return to school until at least the day after his or her temperature is normal without medication.





#### CAN YOUR CHILD PARTICIPATE IN CLASS?

If your child seems too sluggish and lethargic to pay attention to his or her lessons, he or she should be kept home.

#### ARE THE SYMPTOMS DISRUPTIVE?

Loud, frequent coughing and frequent bathroom breaks can make it difficult for everyone to concentrate on their lessons. Keep your child home until disruptive symptoms have subsided.





#### IS YOUR CHILD CONTAGIOUS?

Ask the doctor if your child is sick with an illness that is contagious. The doctor will tell you when your child is not contagious.

# Spotlight On Learning



#### **Transition**

In Transition we have been learning about letters and sounds through the Little Learners Love Literacy program. Little Learners Love Literacy is an explicit and sequential literacy approach for teaching children to read, write and spell with confidence. It is a systematic and engaging program with focused explicit lessons, games, crafts, music, puppets, drawing and much more. We have been focusing on learning the letters M and S and the sounds they make. Every day we read about Milo the Monkey and Sally the Snake and look for other pictures on the page to match the beginning sound. Additionally, students have loved the mystery sound box and being able to take items out of the box that are associated with the beginning sound for the week. This is helping the students to make connections with the sound to everyday items.

Along with learning the sounds of letters, a vital part of the program is the correct writing formation. Initially, the students trace and copy the letter of the week and have a go at writing on the mini whiteboards. Practicing daily, we aim to have the students writing letters confidently and independently. Here are some photos of students icing and decorating biscuits to create Milo the Monkey. The students had a lot of fun!
