We are currently exploring options for this space to be purposefully reused and looking at utlising the area as a sensory garden. Stephanie Pollock, Inclusion Support Practioner, has visited other schools and is working on the initial design phases for this space.

### **Projector Works - Assembly Postponed**

I am very pleased to let everyone know that our projector and sound system is being upgraded after waiting for months for parts to be made and sent to Darwin. Half of the assembly area will be out of bounds whilst the works take place and this will mean pushing Friday's assembly back until Tuesday 2nd May (Monday is a public holiday).

Congratulations to one of our parents, Allira Braun, who completed the Boston Marathon last week. For those who don't know, a marathon is 42.2 kilometres!

Allira is a Kungarakan and Gurindji woman from Darwin. Her son Lucian is a Year 6 student at Holy Family.

Allira became the first Indigenous women to complete all six world marathons after first running in the New York City Marathon in 2014, following her selection as part of the Indigenous Marathon Project team. She then went on to complete marathons in Berlin, Chicago, London and Tokyo. Finishing all six of the world's major marathons is a feat completed by only 278 Australians.

Congratulations Allira, you are an inspiration to so many.



### Where Are They Now? Jenny Cuhl



This class photo is from 1985. Can you recognise anyone? What a blast from the past!!!

Jenny started on the very first day Holy Family opened their doors to students, in 1983. She was a Teacher's Assistant. Jenny stopped working in 1986, as she was pregnant with her son Liam. She also had another son, Jordan, before returning to Holy Family in 1993. Both her boys attended Holy Family as well. Jenny finished working at Holy Family in 2011 as an ISA, I had also worked at the Homework Centre during my time at Holy Family.

Now I am enjoying my retirement, playing the Ukulele and spending time with my 8 grandchildren.

One of Jenny's greatest memories at Holy Family was the annual Early Childhood Breakfast.

Transition, Year 1 and Year 2 students arrived at school earlier than usual, dressed in their PJs, with their teddies and their supply of eating utensils. The undercover area was set up with long tables covered in decorated newsprint, done by students in the lead up to the event.

The breakfast choices included two to three cereals, toast, two to three different spreads, juice and milk. These supplies were placed in the middle of the tables for kids to serve themselves.

On completion of the breakfast, the kids cleaned their utensils in wash buckets then dried them. Next it was time to change into school clothes before starting their day in the classroom.

Teachers dressed aptly, some in dressing gowns, slippers and their hair in rollers.

This event required lots of parental support so these parents got to experience the excitement of the kids and the wonderful time enjoyed by all.

This event was part of the School's Camp programme in the 1990s. In those days Year 6-7 went on camp (Year 7 was part of Holy Family then), Year 4-5 went to Bachelor Camp, Year 3 had sleepover at school and then Year T-2 Breakfast.
